New Year's Resolution

Wow, 2010 is already here! Are you making some New Year's resolutions? This tradition began with the ancient Babylonians, who took 11 days to celebrate New Year's – and the most common resolution back then was to return borrowed farm equipment!

Now, maybe you didn't borrow any farm equipment in 2009, but you can borrow some great ideas from Toastmasters that will lead you to success in 2010! Let me suggest a few Toastmasters resolutions for you to consider. Just pick the ones that are most relevant to you.

- Bring a friend to every Toastmasters meeting. You know Toastmasters is a great organization. Tell someone else about it: the people you work with, worship with, socialize with—even your family!

- Finish your Competent Communicator (CC) award or Advanced Communicator (AC) award. The AC is where the educational program becomes fun! You get to choose among manuals like Storytelling, Technical Presentations, The Entertaining Speaker, and so much more.

- Work on the new Competent Leader award. The new CL manual that came out in January 2006 has some wonderful projects to improve your listening, time management, and delegation skills, among others. If you joined Toastmasters in 2006, this manual was part of your new member kit. If you've been a member longer, then you can buy a copy in the TI store for \$6, or at district conferences and TLIs.

- Mentor a new member. Do you remember your first few club meetings? Were they confusing, or did you have someone who explained the program to you? Did anyone express a personal interest in your own goals and progress? Did someone listen to you rehearse your speeches? This is your chance to help a new member discover the Toastmasters program and the dynamics of your club. (And get credit for mentoring in the CL manual too!).

- Run for a club office when the club holds elections at the first meeting in May. It's not so far away. You can get a head start by assisting the current club officer. You'll learn about your club and Toastmasters International, you'll earn the thanks of the current club officer, and you get another great chance to practice your leadership skills! (And receive credit to become an Advanced Leader-Bronze, ALB!)

- For the ultimate Toastmasters thrill, start a new club! It's not as hard as it sounds. Just come up with the concept (where and who), and your Area Governor, Division Governor, and district leadership will put together a team to make it happen. If you enjoy hearing an Ice-breaker, just imagine the agenda at a new club with 20 new members! (And receive credit towards your Advanced Leader-Silver, ALS!)

The important thing is to choose your goals, set a schedule for accomplishing them, and then make them happen. Make sure you are excited about your goals. Visualize the impact that success will have in your life, and keep that in mind as you work your way towards success. Don't be afraid to ask your club members or officers for help either! I know you can do it: Prepare, Practice, Perform!

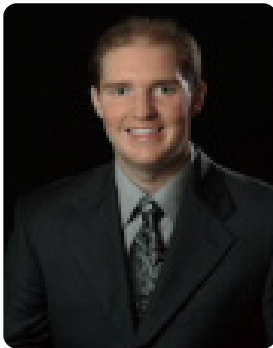

If you have not already checked on your clubs DCP goal status now is the time to make sure your club is on track to becoming a Distinguished club! This is easily found by going to www.toastmasters.org and clicking on the members site tab at the top of the home page. Enter your club number as your login. If you don't know your password, click on the link below the login tab and it will be emailed to you. Then scroll down the list of options to club DCP reports, discover, and share your findings with your club members.

As I write this article, we are in the midst of winter, which means a rare three inches of snow in these parts. It also means snowflakes, snowmen, snowball fights, and of course TLI season! Congratulations to all the new and returning officers of our clubs. One of the most important obligations of being a club officer and one of your clubs DCP goals is to attend a TLI session. As you know you must have at least four (4) of your clubs officers trained to obtain this goal. Better yet, strive for the Super 7 Award and have all your officers trained. Remember that you don't have to be an officer of your club to attend; TLI is open to all members of D25. We will offer not only club officer training, but also several other classes on communication and leadership. We will also offer classes on contest preparation and judges/chief judges training for the upcoming season!

Speaking of contests, its time for the always-exciting Spring Contest Season. This season we will be featuring the Tall Tales and International Speech Contests. Five Star Club Membership Requirements:

- Dues renewal on time by October 10
- Add 4 new members
- Add 4 more new members
- Dues renewal on time by April 10
- Club has 20 members or net growth of 5 by June 30

- Honorable mention in District Newsletter
- Publication in Spring Conference Program*

Details: Clubs must submit dues on time during both renewal periods. Dues must be submitted no later than October 10, 2009 and April 10, 2010 to receive on-time credit. On June 30, 2010, clubs must have 20 paid members or a net growth of 5 members if the base membership was below 20 as reported on July 1, 2009. Clubs must add 4 members, which are defined as new, dual, or reinstated members, and an additional 4 members between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010. Results will be tracked from reports provided by Toastmasters International. Clubs have until June 30, 2010 to complete all five requirements.

* Clubs that complete all 5 by April 30, 2010 will be recognized at the Spring Conference Awards Lunch and in the Program.

If Your Club Elects Its Officers Semiannually

...it's time to submit a list of your club's officers for the January 2010 through June 2010 term. The fastest, most efficient way to notify WHQ is to submit the information online. You can enter the club business section of the Web site at members.toastmasters.org > **Club Officers** > **Conduct Club Business** > **{Club Log In}** > **Change my club's meeting and/or club officer information**. To get on-time credit in the Distinguished Club Program, the information must be entered online by December 31, 2009, or if mailed, and received at WHQ by December 31, 2009.

Newly-elected officers: be sure to attend club-officer training offered by your district team. It will help you have a successful term of office. Check your district's Web site for information. Also be sure your club officer information is up-to-date so your club won't miss any mailings or information from WHQ. Club officer manuals (one for each office) were mailed to each club last June. If you are just taking office, be sure to get these manuals from the outgoing club officers. Additional copies can be purchased online members.toastmasters.org > **Shop**. You can also view the content of each manual online. Navigate to members.toastmasters.org > **Officer Resources** > **Club Officer Resources** > **Club Officer Roles**. Select the appropriate officer position then scroll to the bottom of the page for the link to the PDF.

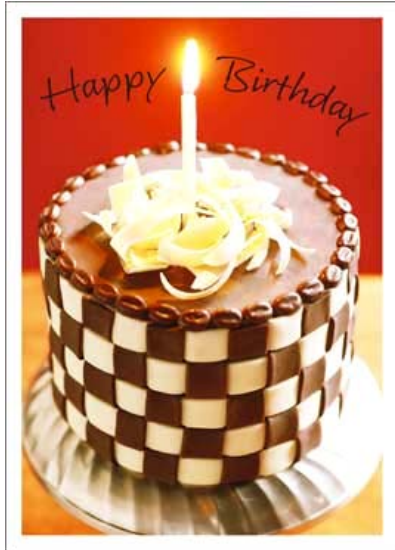
