What makes a Helping Hands Team?

Four toastmasters from other Toastmasters clubs who support the Helping Hands program. The Helping Hands team must be approved by the District 25 Club Growth Director & Club Retention Chair before they can visit in an official capacity. A club coach assigned to the low membership club can be part of the team. All members must agree to attend 4 consecutive club meetings.

Who can be part of a Helping Hands team?

Any member who is identified by a District, Division, Area or Club official as being a member who will promote the Toastmasters Program in a positive way. Team members must agree to attend 4 consecutive club meetings.
